



<b>LOCATES</b>	When excavating to install fences, repair driveways, plant trees, etc. contact Ontario One-Call at 1.800.400.2255 for Town of Hanover water/sewer, Bell, Enbridge Gas, Wightman Telecom, East Link, Hydro One and Westario Power locates. <b>CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!</b>
<b>LAWN WATERING</b>	Residences with even house numbers may water on the even calendar days. Residences with odd house numbers may water on the odd calendar days.
<b>FALL LEAF PICK UP</b>	<p>Public Works staff will collect leaves on Monday or Tuesday in <b>paper compostable bags only</b> commencing the week of October 17, 2022 through to the end of November. Leaves must be placed at the curb.</p> <p><b>Plastic bags will not be accepted.</b> Twigs and small branches are not collected but may be taken to the landfill site free of charge throughout the year during regular landfill hours.</p>
<b>PARKING AND SNOW REMOVAL</b>	<p>The Town of Hanover Traffic By-Law No. 3068-19 has the following two sections under which violations will be enforced by the Hanover Police Service and By-law Enforcement Officer.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>It is an offence to park a vehicle on any roadway anytime when such vehicle will interfere with snow removal operations.</b></li> <li><b>It is an offence to park a vehicle on any roadway between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of December, January, February and March.</b></li> </ul>
<b>CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL</b>	<p>Christmas trees can be dropped off free of charge at the entrance to the Hanover Park at 744 7th Avenue (west side) until January 7th, 2022 or at the Hanover/Walkerton Landfill site during regular business hours.</p> <p><b>Trees will not be collected curbside.</b></p>
<b>FIRE HYDRANTS</b>	<p>With winter upon us, the Hanover Fire Department asks that residents with hydrants on their property assist in keeping them maintained free of snow and ice accumulations. When shoveling, plowing or snow blowing your drive, please ensure that you are not covering the hydrant. Hydrants play a very important part in fire fighting and accessibility to each hydrant is imperative.</p> <p><b>THANK YOU FOR YOUR CO-OPERATION.</b></p>
<b>SNOW PLOWING</b>	<p>During a snow storm, roads are plowed in the following order upon a snow accumulation of 8cm or greater</p> <div>  <div> <div>1.</div> <div>Routes to main access roads/ industries</div> </div> <div> <div>2.</div> <div>Routes to schools</div> </div> <div> <div>3.</div> <div>Remainder of streets and cul-de-sacs</div> </div> </div> <p>Winter weather and road conditions are monitored by Public Works and on-call personnel after hours. Roads and sidewalks are cleared in accordance with provincial maintenance standards. A number of factors including temperature, forecasts and precipitation determine how and when plowing, salting and sanding take place. Each snow plow is assigned a designated area of the Town and clearing is carried out on the basis of the above priorities. **RECYCLING COLLECTION SERVICE**  
Bi-weekly curbside collection of recyclables and cardboard is provided to all residential, commercial and institutional properties. The 2022 Blue Box Collection calendar, including details about our Recycling Program and products accepted for recycling, is enclosed. Please keep this information for your reference throughout 2022.

**RECYCLING REMINDERS**

- Place recyclables beside the road or curb by 6:00am on your designated collection day.
- Flatten and bundle all corrugated cardboard to a maximum size of 30" x 30" x 8". Place beside your blue box.
- Rinse all food / beverage containers before placing in your blue box.
- Maximum blue box size is 83 litres and shall weigh no more than 23 kg. (50 lbs.)
- All material must be loose in blue boxes except for shredded paper which must be placed in paper bags. RECYCLING MATERIALS PLACED IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.**

**GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE**  
Weekly curbside collection of household garbage is available to all residential dwellings and apartments **with not more than five units**. Collection service is provided on the following schedule:

- Collection for north of 10th Street, including the north side of 10th Street – Thursdays
- Collection for south of 10th Street, including the south side of 10th Street – Fridays

**REMINDER**

- Place garbage beside the road or curb before 6:00am on your scheduled day to ensure pickup.
- All bags must be tagged for collection by wrapping the bag tag around the neck of the bag.
- If you are using a garbage container, all waste must be enclosed in an outer bag.
- Any loose waste will not be collected.

**CLEAR GARBAGE BAG POLICIES**  
The outer bag containing waste shall be clear and transparent (non-tinted). Bags shall be no larger than 26" x 36" and can be placed in a waste container for collection. Each bag placed at the curb for collection shall weigh no more than 50 lbs (23 kg). Multiple clear kitchen catcher size (20" x 22") bags may be placed inside the larger clear bag. If your waste is not collected, a sticker indicating the reason why will be attached to the bag. Town of Hanover bag tags are required to be wrapped around the neck of the bag. To address privacy of personal items, one solid colour "privacy bag" no larger than 20" x 22" (the size of a kitchen catcher or grocery bag) inside each 26" x 36" clear bag is permitted.

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION SITES

The following hazardous waste items will be accepted at no charge throughout the year at the following locations:

### PHARMACEUTICALS AND SHARPS

Please check with your local pharmacy.

### OIL AND OIL FILTERS

Jiffy Lube will accept used motor oil and oil filters at no charge.

### PAINT AND STAINS

Cuneo Interiors (no stain), Hanover Home Hardware and Hanover Rona Building Centre will accept partial cans of paint and stain. Please do not mix paint/stain materials together. All paint and stain must be in original containers and not dried out. Empty paint containers can be placed in your blue box for regular recycling pick up. Please remove lid before placing in box.

### FLUORESCENT LIGHTING

Compact fluorescent bulbs and fluorescent tubes are accepted at Hanover Rona Building Centre.

### ALKALINE AND RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES

- Alkaline batteries can be dropped off at the Civic Office, Landfill Site trailer, Hanover Home Hardware, Hanover Rona Building Centre, Canadian Tire and Hanover Public Library.
- Rechargeable batteries can be dropped off at the Civic Office, Landfill Site trailer, Hanover Rona Building Centre, Canadian Tire and Hanover Public Library.

### CELL PHONES

Cell phones will be accepted at the Hanover Public Library.

### \* NEW \* PERMANENT DOG TAGS

Starting in 2021, permanent dog tags will be issued to each registered dog in Hanover for the lifetime of the dog. Visit the Municipal Office at 341 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Hanover from Monday to Friday, 10:00am to 4:30pm, to register your dog and receive your permanent dog tag. **Replacement for lost or worn out tags will be issued, as required, at a fee of \$7.00 each.**

Dog owners listed on the register will be invoiced in January as per the fees prescribed by the Municipal Rates & Fees By-Law. If you no longer have the animal for any reason, the tag shall be returned to the Town of Hanover prior to March 31<sup>st</sup>. Any Outstanding or late payments after March 31<sup>st</sup> shall be added to the final tax bill.
