

Park Locations



April 2021 | Council approved Parks Assessment Objectives

- In 2021, council approved a number of parks assessment recommendations to improve and enhance Hanover's placemaking opportunities, to connect residents to nature, to increase the play value of playgrounds and to repurpose existing playgrounds. One of the approved recommendations was:
 - To plan for a centre of excellence (destination) park in partnership with an organization.

April 2021 | Council approved Parks Assessment Objectives

- ➤ To maintain playground equipment and prepare a replacement & enhancement plan for:
 - Optimist Park
 - Kinsmen Ball Park
 - Robert F. Steers / Legion Park
 - To consider and plan for the alternate use for Kinette Park (21st Avenue).



4th Street Crescent Park

- Renamed from Optimist Park to 4th Street Crescent Park
- \$75,000 new playground install completed
- Funded through Ontario Builds | Ontario Trillium Foundation Capital Building Stream



Kinsmen Ball Park


- \$87,000 Playground Retrofit completed
- Funded through Ontario

 Building Stream

➤ \$40,000 in Playground enhancements completed in 2024

- The course is currently rated 4.1 out of 5 stars
- Partnership with Hanover Public Library for lending discs
- Adding "short tees" this year






Trail Update

➤ Hanover's community trails is a key cultural asset and plays a vital role in the delivery of creating an environment for healthy living, promoting active participation and attracting visitors to our community




East End Trail Update

- Trail development details are underway to provide connectivity to new neighbourhoods as the Town expands to the East




East End Trail Update

East End Trail Update


- Work Completed:
 - Environmental Impact study
 - SVCA Consultations
 - Engineering
- The Saugeen Cedar West trail connection will be established along the southern boundary of the development from 24th Ave to the current trail.



Trail Bridges Update

Trail Bridges

- Bridge construction is complete
- The south section of the trail north of Concession
 2 is once again open to the public



Trail Bridges

Bridges, 1 and 2, were replaced with prefabricated steel trusses, timber deck and sub structure components









Trail Bridges

- Bridge 3, has been rehabilitated and includes replacement of the timber deck and railing
- Bridge 4 has been replaced with new prefabricated steel trusses approach spans, timber deck, railing and sub structure components while maintaining the rehabilitated existing steel pony truss.








Trail Bridges Re-opening Ceremony

Centre of Excellence Park

April 2021 | Council approved Parks Assessment Objective

In 2021, a council approved recommendation was as follows:

'to plan for a centre of excellence (destination) (COE) park at the Hanover Park location in partnership with a community organization(s), i.e., service club. To facilitate and establish a memorandum of understanding with a community organization(s) and then implement the plan."

What is a Centre of Excellence (COE) Park?

A Centre of Excellence (COE) Park is a unique greenspace that has been developed to be multigenerational, inclusive, and larger in size than a typical neighbourhood park. COE Parks incorporate multiple features/ amenities and are also known as destination parks as people are often willing to travel to these parks for the experience.

COE Park & Splash Pad Feasibility Study

- ➤ In 2023, the Town hired a Landscape Architect to conduct a feasibility study to investigate:
 - Hanover Town Park's suitability for a COE development
 - > potential locations for suitability for a splashpad development
- Further, if Hanover Park is identified as the recommended location for the splash pad development, this would be the first phase for the COE.

COE Park & Splash Pad Feasibility Study Results

- The study included community engagement via online survey to collect input from residents to help guide the recommendations
- The report provided us with:
 - a conceptual plan
 - financial projections

COE & Splash Pad Development

- ➤ The COE will be multi-year project and include multiple phases of development, construction & completion, with the Splash Pad identified as the first phase
- Currently, Council direction supports the Splash Pad portion of the overall concept
- COE development will require further consideration for the phased development and a financial plan that will require Council approval.

A splash pad brings many benefits to our community.

It can provide:

- A spot where families and individuals can gather together
- An inclusive activity for children of all abilities and needs
- A tech-free outdoor activity that encourages active play without the distractions of screens & technology
- A free activity for everyone to enjoy regardless of their income level
- An attraction for visitors to Hanover to support our local businesses

759



Participation

We heard from 759 individuals:

- Permanent Residents (73%)
- Residents outside of Hanover (25%)
- Hanover Business Owners (2%)



Respondents with children said they would use a splash pad if it were located at:



93% Hanover Park



83% Kinsmen Ball Park



50% Heritage Square

Top 5 features that respondents would like:

- Washrooms 72%
- Viewing and seating 70%
- Other recreation amenities 70%
- Variety of water features 69%
- Activites for different age groups 68%

Top 5 issues respondents had with other splash pads:

- No shade 63%
- Limited Seating 44%
- No Washrooms 36%
- Limited opening hours 27%
- Not accessible 24%



WHERE?

Location - Hanover Town Park - 780 7th Avenue

Adding a splash pad to Town Park will enhance the functionality of the park and compliments the existing amenities such as:


- Sufficient space to build a splash pad of reasonable size
- Existing washrooms which will be upgraded
- Other popular recreational activities already on site
- Parking availability
- Proposed future site of the Centre of Excellence Park
- Can accommodate a large number of visitors



SPLASH PAD FEATURES:

- Approximate size: 275 Square Metres
- Colourful, inviting and fun design that suits a variety of age groups
- Concrete pad with various in-ground and overhead water spray features
- Push button start and timed shut off
- Fully accessible environment promoting inclusive play for all children
- Renovated and fully accessible washroom and pump house facility
- Safe and reliable water "flow-through" system







CONSTRUCTION COSTS & PROJECT TIMING

- The overall project cost is estimated at \$640,000
- To succeed, the community needs to raise a minimum \$300,000 towards the project
- The timeline for completion is dependent on reaching the fundraising goal
- The goal is to send the project to tender in 2024, if the fundraising goal is met
